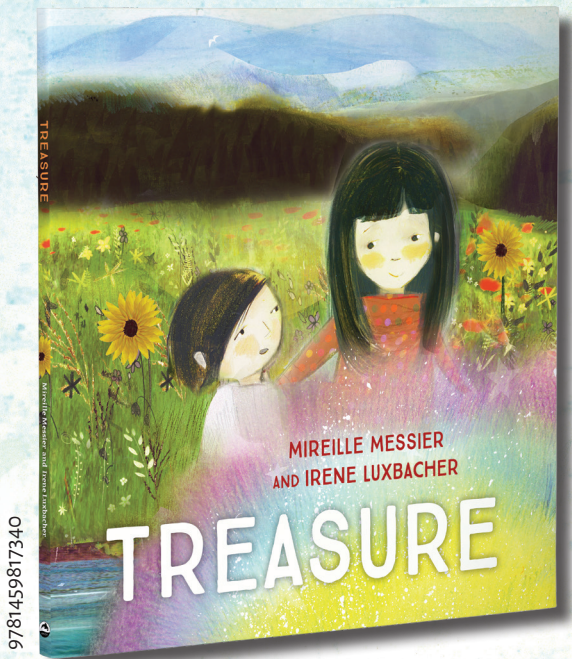
DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Take a walk around your community and look for your own treasure. What do you see?

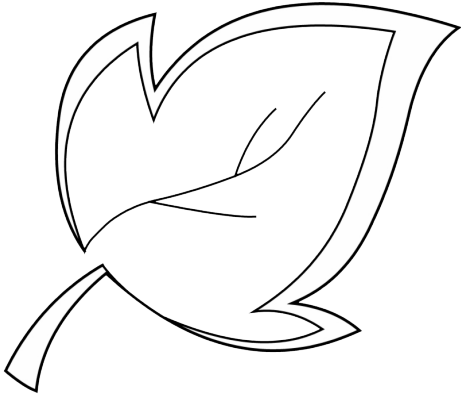
Here's a checklist you can use for your very own treasure hunt:

- Something hidden

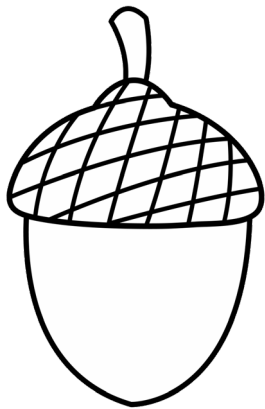

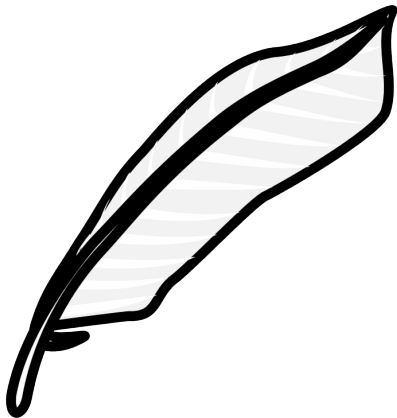
DRAW YOUR OWN TREASURE



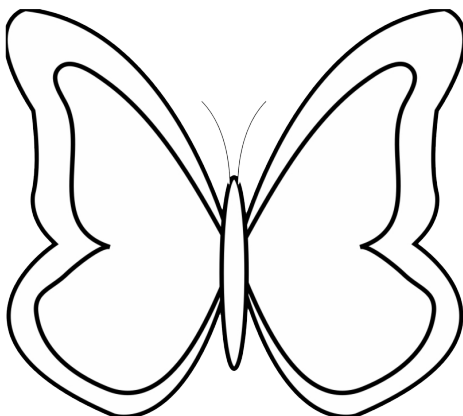
1. Draw a picture of your favorite part from *Treasure*.
