About the Writing

In the Justine McKeen series, I'm trying to help kids learn about new ways they can show concern for environmental issues at home or at school. When I learned about the big impact that food waste has on the planet, I wanted to share that with readers—through the eyes of Justine!

Teaching Ideas—Curriculum Connections***Prereading Ideas***

Spend some time in the classroom discussing the different energy needs that it takes to grow food and get it from the farm to the kitchen. Then, discuss whether students have their own gardens and what they would see as fun or not fun about growing their own food.

Classroom Discussion Questions

1. What are three things you ate today that aren't grown locally and how did they arrive at your table from where they were grown?
2. What foods taste great as leftovers and what food do you hate as leftovers?
3. Are there some foods that are good for humans to eat that animals shouldn't eat?
4. Instead of throwing away food, how can it be used in a good way?

Suggested Activities

- Ask each student to come up with a recipe to use for leftovers. Then combine all the recipes into a classroom cookbook.
- Have students come up with a plan to reduce food waste in the cafeteria.
- Have students make posters to encourage reduction of waste. Place posters up in the hallways.
- Have students design a brochure that can be emailed as a PDF to send to parents on how to reduce food waste.
- Have students keep a daily food waste journal to see how much food they waste in a week.
