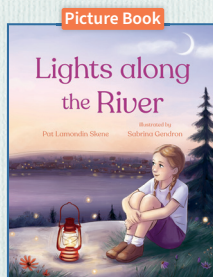
A hummingbird arrives with teachings of love and resilience. Written in both English and Anishinaabemowin.



A little deer tricks a greedy raven into sharing his food; features Coast Salish art.



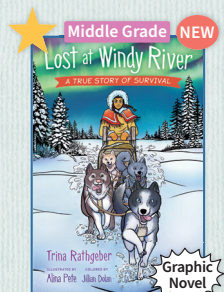
