
## THE LOST LOOT









1. Butterflies go through many stages before they become the winged insects that we know them as. Number these illustrations from 1 to 6 to show the life stages of a butterfly.














2. Do you have family members or neighbors who pay you to do chores and other jobs for them? What sort of chores are they?



3. Help Fern figure out which objects would set off the metal detector and circle them! Draw an X through the objects that wouldn't be detected.





4. Are you saving up to buy something? What is it?
