#### About the Series

Meg and Greg is a decodable chapter book series designed for ages 6–10, featuring dyslexia-friendly formatting and engaging stories for striving readers who've aged out of traditional phonics books. Each book is co-written by Elspeth Rae and Rowena Rae and published by Orca Book Publishers.

The books are structured for shared reading: one page in accessible plain text for a more confident reader (parent, teacher or peer), paired with a facing page of controlled, decodable text for the developing reader.



Decodable books:

- Use specific, predictable phonics patterns
- Help readers practice decoding skills in connected text
- Support the transition from phonics instruction to fluent reading
- Build confidence by ensuring a high success rate

# How Meg and Greg Supports Literacy

- Shared Reading Format: Encourages reading together without the developing reader feeling overwhelmed.
- **Structured Phonics Progression**: Each story focuses on specific sound-spelling patterns (e.g., consonant blends, digraphs, vowel teams).
- Inclusive Design: Larger font, generous spacing, cream-coloured paper and illustrations that aid comprehension.

• **Appealing Stories**: Mystery, adventure and humour to engage a broad range of readers.



## Practical Ways to Use in the Library

## 1. Small-Group Reading Sessions

- Pair developing readers with a volunteer, peer mentor or staff member.
- Alternate pages: fluent reader takes plain text page, developing reader reads the decodable page.
- Pause to discuss the story and tricky words.

# 2. Family Literacy Programs

- Include the Meg and Greg series in take-home literacy kits.
- Offer "shared reading" workshops for parents and model the alternating page format.

## 3. One-on-One Reader Support

- Keep a set in the library's "Reader Support" collection alongside other hi-lo and dyslexia-friendly titles.
- Use during homework help or tutoring sessions.

## Practical Ways to Use in the Classroom

- Literacy Centers: One station for paired reading with Meg and Greg
- Intervention Support: Use in Tier 2 or Tier 3 small groups for focused phonics reinforcement.
- Cross-Curricular Links: Use themes to connect with social studies or science topics.

## Practical Ways to Use in the Classroom

- Start by matching the story's focus phonics pattern with the reader's current skill level.
- Don't over-correct. Let the reader attempt the word first, then give gentle support.
- Celebrate successes, even small ones.
- Use the series' built-in glossary to preview or review tricky words.
