Themes:

Discussion Questions & Activities:

- 1. Do you think Maya and Plum's friendship will survive the strain caused by this incident?
- 2. For the first part of the book, Maya remembers Ross from the point of view of her younger self. When does that change?
- 3. Do you think the #MeToo movement made a difference in the way women are treated now, nearly a decade after it began?
- 4. Is consent—asking for or giving it—a topic of conversation you feel comfortable having with people you date? How do you approach it?
- 5. If a friend told you they had been in a situation with an adult that felt wrong, what would be your advice?
- 6. Maya has the chance—and somehow the courage—to tell Ross exactly what she thinks about what happened. But speaking face-to-face can be scary. What would you write in a letter or an email to someone who has lost your trust?
- 7. Choose a supporting character (Jones, Ava, Eddie, Milan, Bella, Patty or Talia) and write a paragraph from their point of view about something that happens in the book.

Word Study

Reading is the best way to add new words to your vocabulary. Keep a list of words from *One Kiss* that you don't recognize, to look up, define and practice spelling. Examples: statuesque, sidekick, alias, chandelier, paparazzi, contagious, well-being and misleading.
