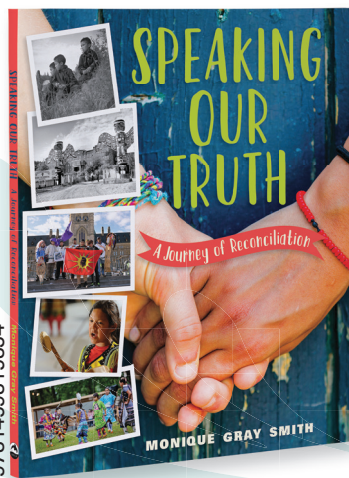
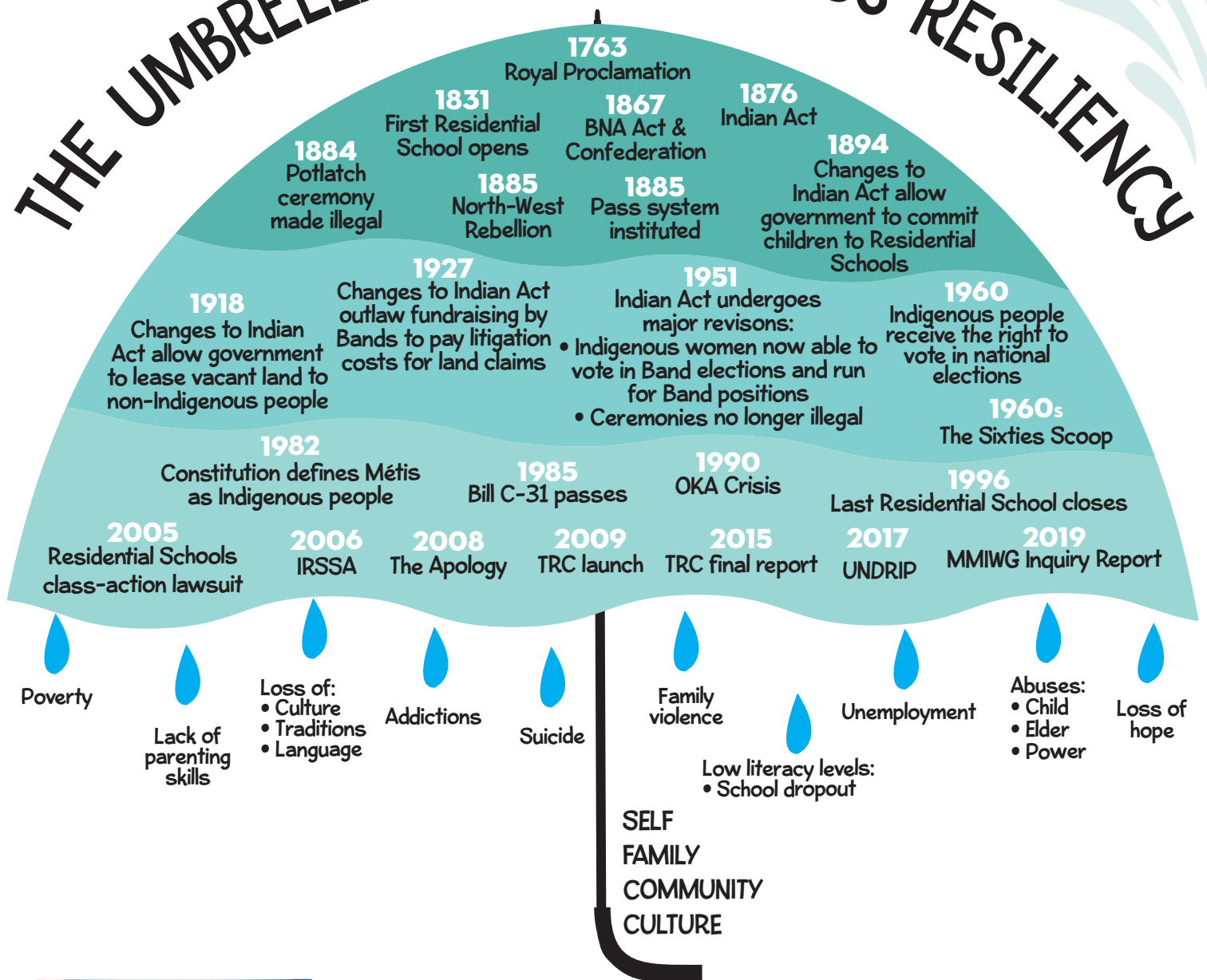


THE UMBRELLA OF INDIGENOUS RESILIENCY
