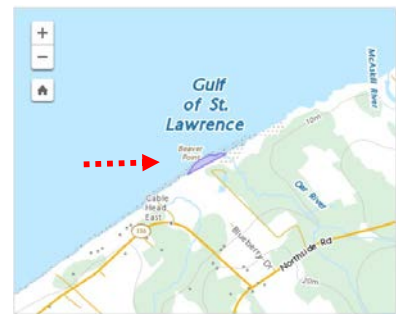


# Typical Example of the use of the CGNDB to explore Beaver Habitat

The search for "beaver" identified only 1 geographical name for this small province: **Beaver Point** which can be located on the topographical map.



To find out if there are now beavers in this area, find this location on Google, Apple or Bing satellite images: look for dark water surfaces

Zoom in to find beaver ponds, beaver dams (red arrows), lodges (yellow arrows), meadows and canals (blue arrows).



Oblique view of Beaver Point: Beaver ponds and dams are very close to the shoreline. The beaver area on the previous slide is about 2 km inland
