He dreamed of sharing paddling adventures with his grandchildren but did not live long enough to realize that dream. *In the Red Canoe* does that for him. What's your impact on the environment around you?

This illustrated nonfiction picture book by child psychologist Dr. Jillian Roberts introduces children to the important topic of the environment. Crafted around a conversation between a grade-school-aged child and an adult, this inquiry-focused book using age-appropriate language and tone will help children shape their understanding of the natural world and how they participate in protecting it. Dr. Roberts starts the discussion with the types of pollution and trash that children might notice on a nature walk or a trip to the beach, how they are caused and how to work to improve things in their own lives and communities.

The World Around Us series introduces children to complex cultural, social and environmental issues they may encounter outside their homes, in an accessible way. Sidebars offer further reading for older children or care providers who have bigger questions. For younger children just starting to make these observations, the simple question-and-answer format of the main text will provide a foundation of knowledge on the subject matter.

This is the newest title in The World Around Us series, following books that address poverty, tragedy, prejudice, online awareness and body safety and body image.

JODIE CALLAGHAN is a Mi'gmaq woman from the Listuguj First Nation in Gespe'gewa'gi near Quebec. She has always been drawn to storytelling and has found writing to be the best way to connect to her history and her culture. She was inspired to write *The Train* after listening to many people tell her about their residential school experiences. Jodie is currently working as an adult-education teacher in her community. She lives with her husband, child and two pugs.

GEORGIA LESLEY is a Canadian-born professional artist and illustrator living in British Columbia's Cariboo Region. Her illustrations have been published by Scholastic Canada and in various materials, including books, posters and calendars for the Nlaka'pamux Nation Tribal Council, the Fraser Thompson Indian Services Society, Doctors of BC and the First Nations Health Authority. Georgia is primarily self-taught. She loved drawing and painting as a child, which started a lifelong passion. She began illustrating in 2006 and strives to create a sense of depth, emotion and visual storytelling to assist and enhance the written word.

Mervin is ruining everything!



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

Lauren can't keep Will a secret forever.




Somebody knows something.

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


It's Stella's time to shine.

Although his pursuers have modern technology to help them, Nick has something even more useful. In addition to the skills he's learned, he has an ally in the natural world around him. *Found*, like the famous story "The Most Dangerous Game," is a tale that focuses on being hunted until a way can be found to become the hunter.

JOSEPH BRUCHAC is a writer, storyteller, proud Nulhegan Abenaki citizen and respected Elder among his people. He lives in the Adirondack Mountains foothills town of Greenfield Center, New York, in the same house where his maternal grandparents raised him. Much of Joseph's writing draws on that land and his Native American ancestry. Although his northeastern American Indian heritage is only one part of an ethnic background that includes Slovak and English blood, those Native roots are the ones by which he has been most nourished. He works extensively on projects involving the preservation of Abenaki culture, language and traditional Native skills, including performing traditional and contemporary Abenaki music with the Dawnland Singers. Joseph is the author of more than 140 books for children and adults. He discusses Native culture in his books and presents storytelling programs at dozens of elementary and secondary schools each year as a visiting author.


